
Science Week 2023.

Science Week took place recently and was a great success. The children enjoyed taking part in enjoyable and practical activities all week.

Some 2nd Class students from Ms. J. McGrath's class now outline their experience of participating in the initiative.

"We had fun with the volcano. We put baking soda and vinegar in the volcano. Then it erupted. We made circuits using telephone wire, a battery, a small bulb and insulation tape. (The big bulb did not work). We used insulators (wood and plastic) to break the circuit and conductors (metal) to keep the electricity flowing through the circuit. The bulb lights when the electricity flows in a circuit. We hooked alligator clips to the battery, and then to the insulator, and back on to the battery again. We put food colouring in the water and watched how celery 'drank' up the food colouring through its veins. We used big torches to test transparent and opaque materials. Transparent things allow light to shine through. Opaque things do not allow light to shine through. We had lots of fun setting up the science experiments."

The boys and girls are learning lots of new skills and having great fun at the same time.


